IN THE DELAWARE MUNICIPAL COURT

Waiver Schedule

Effective June 21, 2024

The Delaware Municipal Court established a Traffic Violations Bureau and appointed the Clerk of Court as the violations clerk. The Violation Bureau accepts appearance, waiver of trial, plea of guilty, and payment of fine and costs for offenses within its authority. **Any person charged with a third offense or more within a year, or any violation marked "personal appearance required," must appear on their assigned court date.** All offenses listed below, along with their corresponding fine and cost amounts (the "waiver amount"), may be disposed of by the Traffic Violations Bureau. Any person who pays the waiver is pleading guilty and waiving the right to a trial.

The full waiver amount must be paid prior to your first court date.
