Why Community Choice Aggregation for 100% Clean Energy?



Save Delaware households money on their electric bills and protect families from pricing volatility



Support Ohio energy jobs, keep our dollars in Ohio



Freedom of choice for participants - no fee opt-out, net-metering



Do our part to address climate change and reduce harmful emissions that impact the health of our community





How?

Approve ballot language

City council approves ballot language and city files ballot issue with Delaware County Board of Elections (no later than August 4th).

• Run 'Yes' issue campaign

Sustainable Delaware Ohio (SDO)—in partnership with Power a Clean Future Ohio (PCFO) and Ohio Environmental Council (OEC)—will implement a campaign in the community to support passage.

Partner with non-profits for public education


A coalition of non-profit organizations (SDO, PCFO, OEC) stands ready to support the City of Delaware to provide public education resources for the community. See <u>webpage here</u>.

Choose supplier

After ballot issue passes, the city can move forward in 2022 by choosing a broker/supplier or by joining a government aggregator (e.g., SOPEC, NOPEC).

Recent Aggregation Success



Columbus passed Issue 1, Community Choice Aggregation

Voters approved Issue 1 by 76% for 100% renewable energy (2020)



Grove City passed Issue 10, Community Choice Aggregation

Voters approved Issue 10 by 63% for 100% renewable energy (2020)



Worthington passed Issue 39, Community Choice Aggregation

Voters approved Issue 39 by 75% (2018)
