Mr. Kridler provided an update on the process to renew the DORA application and recommended changes. Council did not voice opposition to the proposed changes.

Mr. Farrell expressed his desire to continue with discussions of energy aggregation in 2021.

Mr. Hoffman requested Parking and Safety discuss parking on one side of the street after concerns on snow removal. He also discussed options available to residents currently working at home that had wages withheld from the municipality of the company location. He discussed the diversity and bias training for the police department and his support to the training.

Mayor Riggle discussed a notification received regarding no current positive COVID-19 tests from students at Ohio Wesleyan University.
