Mr. Farrell discussed that a formation of a task force would be an important part of the process.

Vice-Mayor Shafer was in agreement to bring in an outside expert and thanked staff for their efforts.

Mr. Hoffman discussed that community members are interested in participating in a task force and need to look at the application process to get participation. He questioned how we the City can reach out and make sure that the task force is diverse and inclusive.

Mrs. Keller recommended reaching out to already formed organizations and community members to assist in reaching out to the community.

Mayor Riggle discussed different ways to inform the community of seats available on boards and commissions.

Ms. Butler discussed the new hiring by MORPC for their Diversity Officer in May 2020. She discussed the benefits of reaching out to local community members that are already working on diversity and inclusion in the City.

The Clerk read into the record an email submitted by Mr. Gherman. Mr. Gherman voiced the concern that racism is a public emergency and that there is a lack of BIPOC represented within local city government.

The Clerk read into the record an email submitted by Ms. Vinson-Reid. Ms. Vinson Reid discussed that racial and economic inclusion are vital to the City's growth.
